A LETTER FROM PASTOR FRYE

November 2022

Dear Family and Friends of St. Luke,

The month of November is full. There is much to observe, celebrate, and commemorate. We begin with All Saints Sunday, then Christ the King Sunday, then our National Day of Thanksgiving, and finally, we end with a beginning as we enter the Season of Advent. It is a time of transition. The days grow darker, the weather, colder. Sometimes we can become overwhelmed, distracted, and unsettled.

During Stephen Ministry Leader Training in these weeks, I have been reading the book, Speaking the Truth in Love. About two thirds of the way through, the following illustration is shared:

Once when Leonardo da Vinci was working on his painting "The Last Supper," he became inordinately angry with a certain man. Losing his temper, he lashed the other fellow unfairly with harsh and bitter words. Returning to his canvas, Leonardo attempted to work on the face of Jesus but was so upset he couldn't compose himself for the painstaking work. Finally, he put down his tools, sought out the object of his wrath, and asked his forgiveness. The man accepted his apology, and Leonardo could then return to his workshop and finish painting the face of Jesus. *

I wonder if being preoccupied with many things, we overlook the one thing needful at the center of our life together. We are called to be the face of Christ to a world in need of good news. Yet, stuck in our own grudges, and campaigns of suspicion, we can be rendered unrecognizable.

This month is a suitable time to remember the following: First, both our connection to and participation in the great cloud of witnesses; secondly, our status as children of God and fellow citizens of God's Kingdom in Christ; and finally, our calling to long for and prepare the way of the Lord in our life together for the sake of the world.

I encourage us all to take the time necessary to see our relationship with God in Christ and with one another not just as one option among many, but as the central and preeminent reality of our lives. We need to return to our canvas and finish our work. God is a God of means. It is God's work, our hands.
