A LETTER FROM PASTOR FRYE

June/July 2023

Dear Family and Friends of St. Luke,

"Just wait, someday you'll understand." This piece of advice – this suggestion – was shared with me on many and various occasions when I was growing up. As I recall, most often these words came when I was perplexed by the comments of my elders when they tried to describe what it felt like to get up off the floor, or get out of bed in the morning, or to reach down to tie their shoelaces. Loss of flexibility and the accompanying discomfort and pain seemed to me an exaggeration or even fabrication.

Today, when we feel discombobulated, it is usually the result of things not going as anticipated. We have grown to expect certain patterns of behavior, and specific outcomes from tasks and processes to which we have become accustomed. In other words, we like the predictability and comfort of routine.We are satisfied with sameness.

But then, something beyond our control happens. Things change.

It is interesting to note that even while we resist change, we (as a society) frequently lament various ills and ailments: low voter turnout, increased damage caused by a growing carbon footprint, the conditions of the roads, the scarcity of affordable housing, the decline of mainline churches, etc. And yet, we resist change, we push back, we pine for the way things used to be.

And yet, if nothing changes, nothing changes. We cannot always do what we have always done and experience the transformation and flexibility necessary for mobility and a faithful capacity for letting our light so shine before others that they may see our good works and glorify Almighty God in heaven.

During these weeks after Pentecost, may we all grow in our willingness to participate. Let us do the basic things well: pray, read the scriptures, gather for worship, serve those in need. It is good stewardship. Let us reaffirm the implications of our faith and stretch our experience, even when we feel discombobulated. It is what we are called to do in response to all that God has done for us in Christ.

In the parable of the wheat and the weeds Jesus suggests that both grow together until the harvest. Pastor Christian Aguilar from Fruitbelt Farmworkers Christian Ministry will join us to share the message during Worship.

July 30, 9th Sunday after Pentecost, Even as we seek the riches of God's reign, the great surprise is that God's grace finds us first!

THREE PENTECOST PROJECTS FOR 2023

#1 St. Seraphim Center provides lunch to anyone needing a meal on Thursdays and Saturdays— the days the Salvation Army does not serve a meal. This ministry was begun by St. Mary's Antiochian Orthodox Christian Church. St. Luke provides the meal one Saturday per month. During Pentecost we are asking for dry food donations, items for preparing and storing the lunch, and monetary donations for paper supplies and rent. Flyers with specific items needed are in the Gathering Area.

#2 Fruitbelt Farmworkers Christian Ministry supports the workers who come to our area to work in orchards and agricultural fields. The ministry provides pastoral care, recreation, advocacy, and comfort items such as personal care kits, blankets, hoodies or sweatshirts, & hats. Support of this ministry is both a Pentecost project and our "God's Work. Our Hands." project. Flyers with specific items needed are in the Gathering Area.

#3 Lutheran Disaster Response (LDR) has been active in areas affected by earthquakes, tornados, flooding, and other natural disasters, as well as areas suffering from civil conflict and war. LDR continues to work with their partners in response to current disasters across the globe. More information is in the gathering area.
