A LETTER FROM PASTOR FRYE

Epiphany 2024

Dear Family and Friends of St. Luke and St. Paul:

• Grace and Peace to you.

As we have been approaching the cusp of another new year, I have heard many people express relief in being able consign 2023 to the history books. "Let's ring out the old year with gratitude that it is finally behind us." The thing is, don't many of us hear (or say) something like this every year? If that is the case, it is unfortunate. After all, shouldn't we still be basking in the comfort and joy of the gift that is Christmas?

Instead of gleefully watching 2023 disappear in the rearview mirror, what would it be like if we attempted to both review the year past with gratitude for lessons learned and look ahead to the new year with boldness and hope? I think it is in our DNA to be able to do two things at the same time. In fact, it is frequently in the effort to do both/and rather than either/or that we discover more of the truth that sets us free.

Psalm 29 concludes with these words:

O Lord, give strength to your people; give them, O Lord, the blessings of peace.

Most of the verses of Psalm 29 preceding this verse reflect on the power and possibilities of the voice of the Lord. This suggests that if we desire to be the beneficiaries of both God's strength and the blessings of peace, we have both the duty and delight of listening for the voice of the LORD. This may seem overwhelming, strange, or even unfamiliar, but it remains to be understood as a core practice and central orientation of anyone who would identify as a follower of Christ Jesus.

While each of us can take time apart and alone to listen for God in our individual lives, we are also called to make this a practice of our life together as a community of faith. For the past several years now, the congregations of St. Luke and St. Paul have been exploring ways to work together. . . ways that will increase the effectiveness and faithfulness of our common mission in our area.

This next year, may we be more intentional, proactive, and bold in responding to the voice of the LORD. Continue to pray for and encourage the work of the Joint Task Force and both congregational councils. Pray for one another and for an ability to see beyond the walls of our physical buildings so that we may behold God's vision for our lives of service to our community and world.

May we receive the gift of strength and the blessing of peace in this new year.

- February 4 *5th Sunday After Epiphany; In Isaiah the

one God who sits above the earth and numbers the stars also strengthens the powerless.
